

Governor Francis T. Kimemia, E.G.H., C.B.S., HSC

Governor Francis Kimemia serves as Governor for Nyandarua County and also chairs the Water, Forestry and Natural Resources Committee in the Council of Governors.

He holds a BA in Political Science from the University of Nairobi, a BA in Public Administration from Moi University, and a Master's Degree in Business Administration.

He served the Ministry of State for Provincial Administration and Internal Security of Kenya in various roles from 1 January 2002 to 1 January 2012. He also held various roles in the Ministry of State for Education from 1 July 1996 to 1 January 2002.



Governor Hon. Hassan Ali Joho. EGH

His Excellency Hassan Ali Joho is the first governor of Mombasa County and is serving his second five-year term after successfully defending his seat on the August 8th 2017. Governor Joho was first elected on March 4th, 2013 polls. Prior to that he served as Member of Parliament for Kisauni Constituency between 2007 and 2013. During his term in the National Assembly, Governor Joho served as the Assistant Minister for Transport, Vice Chairman of the Foreign, Defense & Election Committee, Library Committee Member and Transport, Housing & Public Works committee member among other positions.

Governor Joho is the National Deputy Party Leader of the Orange Democratic Movement (ODM), a party on whose platform he has been elected since 2007.

Governor Joho is the Chair of the Global Strong Cities Steering Committee Working Group on Communications and Counter Narratives.

Governor Joho is also the Co- President of the 21st Century Maritime Cooperation Committee on Trade and Investments of Cities and Local Governments of Asia-Pacific, Southeast, South Asia and Africa.

He is a team player and a worker with immense skills which connect mostly with the youth and both rural and urban poor.



Dr. Fred Matiangi doubles up as the Chairperson of the National Development Implementation and Communication Cabinet Committee. He has previously served as Cabinet Secretary for Information, Communication and Technology (ICT), Lands and Physical Planning as well as the Ministry of Education.

Prior to his appointment in the capacity of a Cabinet Secretary, Dr. Matiangi was the Regional Representative in East Africa for the Centre for International Development, Rockefeller College of Public Affairs and Policy, the State University of New York (SUNY/CID). He previously served as Chief of Party for Kenya's Parliamentary Strengthening Program.

Dr. Stephen Jackson

Dr. Stephen Jackson took up the role of Resident Coordinator in Kenya in March 2021. He brings close to 30 years of experience in international development, peacebuilding and humanitarian affairs to the position, including more than 10 years in Sub-Saharan Africa.

At the UN, he most recently served as Resident Coordinator in Gabon, after holding leadership positions at the Department of Political Affairs (DPA) and with UN Peacekeeping. In DPA, he served as Chief of Policy Planning and Guidance, headed the Secretariat to the High-Level Review of United Nations Peacebuilding in 2015, worked as Team Leader of the Mediation Support Unit, was Chief of Staff of the UN Office in Burundi (BNUB), led the Policy Planning Unit as well as the Africa Great Lakes Team, and worked as Special Adviser to the Special Envoy of the Secretary-General for the Great Lakes.

With Peacekeeping, he served as a Senior Political Adviser with the UN Organization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUC). Prior to joining the Organization, Mr. Jackson was the Deputy Director of the Conflict Prevention and Peace Forum (CPPF) at the Social Science Research Council (SSRC) in New York and served as the Director of the International Famine Centre and a Lecturer in Sociology at the National University of Ireland in Cork after working in humanitarian relief and development in Angola, Rwanda and Somalia.

He holds a doctorate in cultural anthropology and a master's degree in public affairs from Princeton University, USA, as well as a bachelor's degree in mathematics from Trinity College in Dublin, Ireland.

Capt. Rtd Dr. Simiyu Werunga is a retired military helicopter fighter pilot and an accomplished expert in International security and Strategic Studies. He holds a PhD in International Security and Strategic Studies. He holds two fellowships on China's Diplomatic relations with Africa (Africa scholars Tours). He holds several professional certifications in security Investigations, counterterrorism, Fraud investigations, Disaster management and Ebola Virus outbreak management.

Dr. Simiyu is a leading security consultant and trainer in National and International security, public safety, and Security Sector Reforms. He has been an Adviser and security consultant to the Kenya Judiciary. He served as a member of the National Police Service Commission Vetting Board of Kenya; He served as a member of the National Task Force on Community Policing in Kenya. He has undertaken several Research studies amongst them; Terrorism, armed groups and Militias in the great Lakes Region of Africa and state of insecurity in Kenya among many others.

He continues to provide advisories, consultancies, and trainings to various organisations, bodies and leading media houses in Africa and internationally. He also is a leading analyst on pertinent and topical international security and political issues in Africa and globally. He is the Founding Director of East African Institute of Security Studies (EAISS).

He is the first male winner of the prestigious BBC World News 2018 Komla Dumor award, 2015 winner of the Mo Amin Africa award and 2012 winner of the CNN Multi-choice Africa award. He was recently awarded the 2021 Media Council Investigative Award. He is also a 3-time Media Council of Kenya awards nominee (2015-2017).

Currently Waihiga is the Special Projects Editor at Citizen TV and also hosts the leading prime-time political TV show on Kenya's leading TV station Citizen TV. He has moderated panel discussions on varied topics in Nairobi, Lagos and London for the BBC & the London School of Economics.

Waihiga is also a keynote speaker with nuanced understanding of the African media scene and in July 2019 gave a presentation for Chatham House in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia. He also writes for Citizen TV and for the BBC. Over the last 10 years he has reported from Kenya, Nigeria, Togo, Ethiopia, Uganda and Rwanda.




Governor Capt. Ali Ibrahim Roba

Captain Ali Ibrahim Roba is the Governor of Mandera County in northeastern Kenya. He was re-elected as governor for a second term on August 8, 2017. His first term as governor was from March 4, 2013. Born in Rhamu town in Mandera County on the 15th of March 1974, Roba is married and a loving father.

He studied at the University of Nairobi for both his undergraduate and postgraduate degrees specializing in marketing and strategic management respectively. He attended colleges for various qualifications in Kenya Utalii College, Delta Qualiflight School of Aviation in Fort Worth Texas, Kenya School of Flying among others.

Captain Roba is a pilot with an Airline Transport Pilot License (ATPL). He is a pilot instructor and Examiner. Governor Roba is also the chairman of Frontier Counties Development Council (FCDC), a regional bloc of 10 counties namely Turkana, West Pokot, Marsabit, Samburu, Isiolo, Wajir, Garissa, Tana River, Lamu and Mandera.



Until his appointment as Head of UNDP in Kenya, Mr. Badawi served as the United Nations Resident Coordinator and interim for UNDP South Africa and prior to that UNDP Country Director, in the same country (2014 – 2019).

Mr. Badawi holds a Masters degree in International Management (Finance and Marketing) from American Graduate School of International Management, Thunderbird Campus, Glendale, Arizona and a B. A from Fordham University; B. A in Economics and Business Administration from American University in Cairo.

Ms Carla Mucavi has been the FAO Representative to Kenya as of November 1, 2020. Prior to this appointment, Ms Mucavi worked as Director of FAO Liaison Office in New York from 2015. In this capacity, she represented the Organisation at the United Nations General Assembly, Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), as well as related Committees, functional Commissions, and Subsidiary Bodies, ensuring that FAO mandate and strategic priorities remain at the centre of the Global Agenda, due to its relevance for the attainment of the 2030 Agenda on Sustainable Development.

Ms Mucavi is a career diplomat having served in different functions in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation of Mozambique between 1989 and 2015. This includes the Division for International Organizations and Conferences; Division for Europe and North America and Latin America; as Deputy Director of State Protocol; and as Chief of Cabinet of the Minister for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation. She also served at the Embassy of Mozambique in Ethiopia. Between 2007 and 2015 she was Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Mozambique to Italy, Greece and Malta, and Permanent Representative to FAO, WFP and IFAD.




